



PROF. DR. KENNETH W. STEIN

Dr. Kenneth W. Stein is Professor of Contemporary Middle Eastern History, Political Science and Israel Studies at Emory University in Atlanta. He has taught there since 1977 and in 1998 established and remains Director of the Emory Institute for the Study of Modern Israel. In Spring 2006, he was a visiting professor of Political Science at Brown University.

Professor Stein is the author of numerous books and publications.
